

# **MUSIC NOTES**

For God alone my soul waits in silence, for my hope is from him. He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be shaken. On God rests my deliverance and my honor; my mighty rock, my refuge is in God. Psalm 62:5-7

Today's Psalter reading reminds us that God is our present help and abides with us always. With enduring and steadfast love, our Creator makes space for all of God's children, surrounding our lives with grace upon grace. May our musical offerings celebrate this refuge and give thanks to God!

Margaret Vardell Sandresky is a prolific musician who continues to compose at the age of 102. She is an award-winning American organist, composer, theorist, and professor emeritus of Salem College in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. She was the first woman to present her research at a national music conference, the founding for the Society of Music Theory at Northwestern University (1977). Her interest in theory led to compositions such as *Six Variations on a Ground Bass*. "Ground bass" refers to a pattern of notes that is repeated constantly throughout a work, and in this piece, listeners will hear the bass "climbing" up and down as the movements progress. Each movement contrasts the last allowing the performer to explore a variety of sounds. The movement titles are stylistic markings: Andante solemne means "solemn walking pace," and Largo means "slow and broad." Sandresky regularly includes texts in the beginning of her scores to give context and create a programmatic nature. Her choice for this piece comes from the reading in Exodus in which Moses stumbles upon the burning bush: *Then Moses said*, "I must turn aside and look at this great sight, and see why the bush is not burned up." When the Lord saw that he had turned aside to see, God called to him out of the bush, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am." Then he said, "Come no closer! Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground."

Love to Thee is an arrangement by Molly Ijames that combines "More Love to Thee, O Christ," and "My Jesus, I Love Thee." Composed in the style of a lullaby, Ijames sets these two 19<sup>th</sup> century hymn tunes with care, aware of the prayerful texts:

More love to Thee, O Christ, more love to Thee! Hear Thou the prayer I make on bended knee; This is my earnest plea: more love, O Christ, to Thee, More love to Thee!

My Jesus, I love thee, I know thou art mine; for thee all the follies of sin I resign; my gracious Redeemer, my Savior art thou; if ever I loved thee, my Jesus, 'tis now.

I'm so grateful to my dear friend Sylvalia Brown for sharing her gifts with us this day. *Goodness of God* is a modern gospel song by artist CeCe Winans; like today's Psalter reading, it speaks of God's abiding presence with us, guiding and sustaining.

I love you, Lord, for your mercy never fails me. All my days, I've been held in your hands. From the moment that I wake up until I lay my head, I will sing of the goodness of God. 'Cause all my life you have been faithful, and all my life you have been so, so good. With every breath that I am able, I will sing of the goodness of God. I love your voice. You have led me through the fire. In darkest night you are close like no other. I've known you as a father, I've known you as a friend, and I have lived in the goodness of God. Your goodness is running after me. With my life laid down, I'm surrendered now; I give you everything. Your goodness is running after me.

As we depart, may we be inspired to greater faithfulness, and may our compassion overflow as we share the goodness of our God with those we meet along the way. Recalling our opening hymn, David Lasky's joyful setting, Postlude on Foundation, celebrates this text of assurance: Fear not, I am with thee, O be not dismayed, for I am thy God, and will still give thee aid; I'll strengthen thee, help thee, and cause thee to stand, upheld by my righteous, omnipotent hand.
