

Music Notes

Blessed be the name of the LORD from this time on and forevermore. From the rising of the sun to its setting, the name of the LORD is to be praised. Psalm 113: 2-3

Identifying the purpose of music is difficult because there is no singular answer. Music is praise, proclamation, cultural identity, education, therapy, ritual, and entertainment. The list goes on and on, but at its heart, music is meant to express, providing a space for us to process and affirm feelings that run deeper than words. The news has been filled with an increasing amount of heartbreak, and our society seems consistently on the precipice of instability. It's difficult for me to express just how I feel; I imagine you feel much the same. My hope is that today's musical meditations will guide us to the peace that God offers and help us to clearly see how we might answer the call to care for a troubled world.

As we gather and leave worship, we will hear Robert Lau's prelude and postlude on the hymn tune ST. DENIO (*Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise*). The prelude experiments with lovely harmonies over a solo voice in the melody, while the pedal plays a continuous pedal point that never changes. The pedal creates a foundation for the reflective prelude, while the postlude contrasts with much movement and full organ.

Unresting, unhasting, and silent as light, nor wanting, nor wasting, thou rulest in might: thy justice, like mountains high soaring above; thy clouds, which are fountains of goodness and love.

The prelude is a beautiful setting of the George Herbert text *I Got Me Flowers* by Daniel Burton. (See the text inside the bulletin.) Burton employs text painting in this work. When the lower voices sing of the "sun arising" the upper voices sing a descant of "Alleluia." The final verse begins with a question, and the voices soar gloriously up to "that one ever."

Herbert's account of the resurrection is intimate and stirring. Written around 1633, it stands in contrast with other poetic themes of the period that call a sleeping loved one to awake and make the most of the days that they have left, for life is short and there is much to do. Rather than finding a slumbering friend, the reader finds Christ already risen at "break of day." The final stanza collapses calendar time; even though we count "three hundred" days (i.e., a fleeting year), there is ultimately only one true day—Easter—because Christ's rising inaugurates everlasting life. We are Easter people, and each time we gather, we bear witness to the Resurrection.

George Thalben-Ball's *Elegy* was not initially written for publication. During World War II, Thalben-Ball improvised a quiet, reflective organ solo as the voluntary after a broadcast Evensong service at the Temple Church. The BBC producer requested that he play it again the next week, and its popularity grew from there. An "elegy" is a work of art created as a lament or meditation on loss, death, or profound sorrow. This enduring musical emblem of remembrance and hope is appropriate for such a time as this.

A "scherzetto" is a shortened "scherzo"- a lively, playful piece. Florence Price's music always brings me joy, and this work demonstrates how sprightly, animated character pieces can be used for worshipful praise.

We sing the response, "God, Be the Love to Search and Keep Me" frequently throughout the year. Consider its text closely today as we pray for God to move our voices and choices to acts of justice and love.
